Research Design Proposal

- ✓ RQ1: How effective is formal learning of Korean P.E. student teachers from teacher educators?
 - ✓ Survey questioning to select appropriate participants
 - ✓ Open-ended interview questions: consent forms, research rapport and anonymity, member checking with interviews.
 - ✓ Transcribing of data to determine main themes and categories.
- ✓ RQ2: How do Korean P.E. students effectively develop communication in an informal environment amongst peers?
 - ✓ Focus group interviews
 - ✓ Pre- and post-: one-researcher interviewer and one-researcher field notes
 - ✓ Transcribing and interpreting field notes to determine themes and categories, member checking with students and expert qualitative analyzers
